

Adult – Trauma

The Adult Trauma Program at WMCHHealth is proud to announce the acceptance of four abstracts for the American College of Surgeons Trauma Quality Improvement Program’s Annual Conference: November 15-17. The abstracts include two poster presentations and two podium presentations.

- 1 The first presentation will report on a trauma registry-based initiative to improve documentation and quality for deep vein thrombosis (DVT) prophylaxis using data from the trauma quality improvement program (TQIPS).
- 2 The second will focus on mitigation of ventilator-associated pneumonia at a Level 1 trauma center, using a TQIP data-driven, multidisciplinary approach to performance improvement.
- 3 The third will show how the integration of trauma service, emergency and critical care nursing leads to performance improvement at a Level 1 trauma center.
- 4 The fourth will present a multidisciplinary approach to geriatric trauma patients to prevent recurrent falls

Kartik Prabhakaran, MD, Medical Director, Trauma Services began an IRB-approved geriatric falls and secondary trauma study aimed at identifying patients >65 years old who were admitted to WMCHHealth secondary to a fall. WMCHHealth produced a Geriatric Fall Prevention and Awareness video featuring Dr. Prabhakaran and the injury prevention team, highlighting the CDC’s 10-step guidelines for geriatric fall prevention and awareness.

- Helps crews to deliver an accurate and detailed hand-off report
- Helps EMS providers highlight key clinical data when calling in a “note”
- Helps serve as a reminder of key patient talking points

Fall Safety — Did You Know: October is Fire Prevention Month

According to 2020 CDC data, every day more than 300 children ages 0 to 19 are treated in emergency rooms for burn-related injuries, and two will die as a result of such injuries. Knowing how to prevent this leading cause of child injury is a first step toward keeping children safe and secure and helping them thrive and grow. The CDC offers the following tips to help protect children from burn injuries:

- ✓ Be sure to install and maintain smoke alarms in your home!
- ✓ Create and actually practice a family fire escape plan!
- ✓ When cooking always use safe cooking practices: never leave food unattended on the stove and know where your kids are!
- ✓ If open fire or candles are out, always be sure to keep them above 6-7 feet from floor level!
